

Mystery Genre Reading Project: Storyboard/Keynote - Due Friday, October 23

Directions: Select a mystery book at your dot color and read it (see the Mystery Genre Sheet if you need help finding a mystery book). Then, design a storyboard (or Keynote) to retell the story.

Guidelines for your storyboard:

- Make a storyboard (or Keynote) to retell the story.
 - Use a large piece of construction paper and fold it into sections (boxes) (or your iPad). You can get paper from your teacher if needed. Fold in half at least 3 times (first once the long way and twice the other way) so that it makes 8 sections. You can fold it more to make more boxes for retelling your story, but you only need to have 8.
 - Number the sections (boxes) (or Keynote slides).
 - The first box (upper left-hand corner) (or Keynote slide) is for the title & author of the book, the words "STORYBOARD PROJECT", and your name.
 - Retell the story's main events in the remaining boxes (or Keynote slides). When you read them all together, the words you use in each box provide a brief summary of your book. *Plan for each section before you begin to write them on the storyboard!*
 - Each section (or Keynote slide) (except the first box) should have words to retell the story as well as an illustration to go along with the words in the box (or Keynote slides).
 - Write a brief book recommendation on the back of your project (or as a final, extra Keynote slide). Label it as "Book Recommendation" and include your opinion of the book and tell whether or not you would recommend this book; *be sure to include why or why not.*
- Take your time, write & draw neatly, and do your best! *Make sure to only use images you find in the "public domain."*
